Getting Radical -New school focus St Marks Primary Talbot Village.

This High- achieving school has lots of academic and sporting successes to celebrate, however before Bike It came to school knew they had one big area of underachievement-excessive local motor travel. In collaboration with the Bournemouth School Travel Advisor/ Sustrans the school senior management team have been motivated to come up with this- a direct appeal to the parentage of school to change travel habits, both outside and in the reception of school. Launching Bike It with a fantastic all-school bikers breakfast revealed just how enjoyable the journey to school can be without the usual gridlock. There is an intensive programme of activities underway, including 4 practical sessions each for each year 1 and 2 child during Autumn term 2010, Spring term 2011 focusing on year 3 and 4 thereafter 5 and 6 Summer term. British Cycling will be on hand too with Go-Ride!

Heading for Schoolmark Silver-Corpus Christi Primary Boscombe

5 Supported schools are now well on their way to a long-term cycling culture, supported by Sustrans and the Bike It Schoolmark Scheme. This autumn 62 Reception age childen and 34 parents enjoyed a practical session of learning bike controls skills, destabilise training and scootering.
