This years National Bike It Competition included 408 schools racing virtual miles around the whole of Britain, 288, 020 healthy biking trips recorded during March alone! In our area, 9 schools took part completing 12,274 bike trips to school. Epiphany School in Muscliffe completing first and finishing 15<sup>th</sup> Nationally to win a fabulous day prize with Rollapaluza Roller Racing from London. **Bike It Vital Statistics for 2010:** 

- Jason has worked with 6,724 children this spring term, 42 % of activities recorded being an hour-long Bike It activity Session, lesson or club activity.
- New Schools 2010-We will be recruiting 4 new schools this spring, and starting their Bike It journey proper in September term.
- Shelters- 8/12 Schools in Total have now installed new bike Shelters with Bike It expert help, and Sustrans financial backing. Helping them towards a super cycling future.
- Cycle Paths- Bournemouth Borough Council are well on the way to completing 2 major schemes of work on cycle/walk infrastructure at Kings Park (Ashley Road) and Christchurch Road, Greatly benefitting the Boscombe cluster of Bike it schools on their healthy journeys to school.
- School Mark- accrediting schools for their fantastic efforts so far, we will be awarding 7 Bronze School Marks at the Champions Action Day this june.
- Partner Working- Poole Schools have benefitted from joint working by Jason and Andy Halliday of the Rossmore Bike Project.
- Olympic Scheme- Several St Katharines children have completed the 120 bike journeys to school to gain their Gold Medals, with lots of Key Stage 1 and 2 kids already achieving Silver for an equally impressive 70 trips
- Bike It comes to Dorset!- Dorset P.C.T. have commissioned an officer to work in Dorchester and Weymouth schools, more top value action for the areas children.

#### Balanceability.

A further 2 Fleets of balance bikes and trikes are now in use at Kinson and Kings Park Primary Schools. Mainly used by Key Stage One children from 5 years up, these special bikes help provide children with the opportunity through physical play games and challenges, to develop the necessary gross motor skills in order to learn how to ride a bicycle safely and confidently.

Dispensing with the need for stabilisers, these bikes help develop good core stability from an early age and expedite better cycling skills. The trikes are also excellent for special needs children to access physical activity.

Schools include their playground use in golden time, for rewarding good behaviour, as part of the first stage cycle training and most importantly of all- for fun!

## **Xmas competition Results**

We had 460 entries in the X-mas competition, a brilliant contribution to the national total of around 7,500, and we are pleased to say that Alice Emily Launders' entry for October from St Katharine's was chosen for the National Bike It Calendar to be produced for 2011.
