The Go Ride sessions this term have introduced the idea of cycling as a sport to many students, and to finish with a bang, Sustrans was able to arrange for a group to attend a track training session at Bournemouth Cycling Centre with Dave Jowett from British Cycling and Jason Falconer. The group quickly adapted to the fixed-wheel bikes and the students and Mr Mortimer really enjoyed the session. The school has already booked more sessions to take pupils to the track as part of the bike club. Equally exciting was the news that the Wheelers won the first Dorset Schools MTB challenge this term too. Well done to all those involved. Their last minute entry was rewarded by commendable effort from everyone which won the school the

# St Mary's First School learn their bike check A B C.



St May's First School had a new Bike It Champion to start this year, and Mr Smith delighted his class when he brought his own bike to school one day. By looking over all the parts of the bike, the whole class learned how to check a bike before you ride off.

Three important things to check are: A - for correct air pressure in the tyres, B - for are the brakes working? C - for oil the chain. The Bike It Crew from year 4 had the chance to test their skills when Jonathan was in school for a Brighten Up and Cycle Skills day. They correctly remembered what to check, and what to do if you find that something is wrong.

They then had the chance to show their friends how to do the ABC check, before taking part in cycle skills games including sardines and the slow race.

Well done to those who took part in the Brighten Up day. Remember to stay bright when out and about on your bike or scooter.

Studies from California have shown that the more active pupils were, the better the marks they got in numeracy and literacy?

#### ...and across the UK

The results achieved in Dorset contribute to Sustrans' school work throughout the UK. Slowly but surely we're helping to establish a healthy and sustainable travel habit amongst the next generation. In 2010 Sustrans worked with 180,000 children at more than 1,000 schools, overall there was:

- a 125% increase in the number children cycling to school every day
- a safe route to school created for more than 76,000 children
- a drop from 72% to 53% in the number of children who never cycle to school
- 92% of head teachers agreed that Sustrans helped their pupils get more physical activity

We also just had our first report in from our Scottish schools project:

- Every day cycling amongst girls went from just 1% to 5%
- 58% of girls now cycle outside of school, up from only 17% previously

# What's Sustrans up to with schools in your region?

Since the summer we have welcomed three new staff members into the region.

Lucie Taylor joined our team over the summer and is the Sustrans Bike It plus officer for Wiltshire. Lucie is bringing the experience gained as a Bike It officer in the SE into a new role designed to enable both cycling and walking on school journey.

Joe Bigwood joined in October and is the third Sustrans Bike It Officer for Bristol.

Prior to joining Sustrans Joe was a primary school teacher in Bristol. A new post has been created to support the work of the bike it team and we welcome

**Gary Seabrook** into the role of Champion support Officer.

We are also about to appoint a new **Bike It Officer for Torbay** thanks to a Health

Lottery Grant, Torbay Care Trust and Torbay

Council.

A number of new routes to schools have been created in the SW, the largest of which is a new off road route and bridge linking Ottery St Mary to Kings School.

#### School travel news from the UK

It's been another busy autumn term for Sustrans' Schools, Children and Young People team. We now have more Schools officers working around the country than ever before, highlighting the value put on their fantastic work by our partners and funders in local authorities, Primary Care Trusts and in government.

There was a fantastic response to our **Dream Streets competition** with over 2,500 entries from children telling us what *they* would like their local street to look like, from giant rabbits to water slides, egg dispensers to dog vs cats football matches... and a notable lack of cars!

Our **Winter Sticker competition** occupies many pupils as we go to print and we will shortly be launching our **Heroes award scheme** for Sustrans schools. Various officers have worked hard for it to be Inspire marked for London 2012 Olympic games, so children can earn Bronze, Silver or Gold accreditation by achieving various Olympic and Paralympic values related to cycling and sustainable travel.

Our **Free Range Kids** campaign continues to offer free resources to schools and campaign for nationwide residential 20 mph limits (the biggest difference we can make for children's safety and to encourage cycling) and in March **The Big Pedal** aims to generate over a million cycle journeys to school – will you be in the saddle?
